Recognizing AAPI Excellence

**Jumpha Lahiri J**  
An acclaimed author. Her debut collection of short-stories *Interpreter of Maladies* (1999) won the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction and the PEN/Hemingway Award.

**Yuji Ichioka**  
Born in 1936 in San Francisco. American History scholar and Civil Rights activist, Originated the term "Asian American".

**Grace Lee Boggs**  
Born in Rhode Island in 1915, an author, philosopher, and social activist. Her activism focused on working for tenants' rights as a part of the Workers Party.

**Patsy Matsu Takemoto Mink**  
First woman of color and the first Asian-American woman elected to Congress in 1965.

**Jerry Chih-Yuan Yang**  
Created the first internet directory in 1995, which was later renamed Yahoo!
