JUNETEENTH

The Juneteenth National Independence Day is a federal holiday in the United States. It is celebrated annually on June 19 to commemorate the ending of slavery. The holiday's name is a portmanteau of the words "June" and "nineteenth", as it was on June 19, 1865, when Major General Gordon Granger ordered the final enforcement of the Emancipation Proclamation in Galveston, Texas at the end of the American Civil War. The holiday recognizes the first day of freedom for enslaved Africans in Texas and commemorates the end of slavery in the United States as a whole.

The day was recognized as a federal holiday in 2021 when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law. Juneteenth became the first new federal holiday since Martin Luther King Jr. Day was adopted in 1983.

Notable Names

Gordon Granger (November 6, 1821 – January 10, 1876) was born in Joy, Wayne County, New York. He was a career U.S. Army officer and a Union general during the American Civil War. Granger was given command of the District of Texas on June 10, 1865. On June 19, 1865, in the city of Galveston, one of the first orders of business was to post Granger's General Order No. 3 (an American legal decree issued in 1865 enforcing the Emancipation Proclamation to the residents of the U.S. state of Texas and freeing all remaining slaves in the state).

Ben Haith (Hassie Benjamin Haith Jr.), also known as Boston Ben, is an American activist from Boston, Massachusetts. Haith has been active in anti-crime groups since the 1980s. He is the founder of the National Juneteenth Celebration Foundation (NJCF) and created the Juneteenth flag in 1997. According to Haith, the star in the flag represents Texas and the freedom of African Americans in all 50 states. The bursting outline around the star represents a new beginning for African Americans, the curve that extends across the width of the flag (arc) represents new opportunities and promises that lay ahead for Black Americans, while the colors red, white, and blue represent the American flag, a reminder that slaves and their descendants were and are Americans.




