PROMINENT AFRICAN AMERICANS

Bryan Stevenson

(1959-Present)

Bryan Stevenson is a Civil Rights attorney and founder of the Equal Justice Initiative, a human rights organization which has won major legal challenges eliminating excessive and unfair sentencing for vulnerable populations. One of his most high-profile cases was the focus of a novel and movie called, Just Mercy (2019). Mr. Stevenson has initiated major anti-poverty and anti-discrimination efforts that challenge inequality in America which have led to the creation of two cultural sites: the Legacy Museum and the National Memorial for Peace and Justice. These new national landmark institutions chronicle the legacy of slavery, lynching, and racial segregation, and the connection to mass incarceration and contemporary issues of racial bias.



Marie Maynard Daly

(1921-2003)

Marie was an American Scientist and first African-American to receive a Ph.D. from Columbia University and first African-American woman in the United States to earn a Ph.D. in chemistry. She was instrumental in the research and discovery of the link between high cholesterol and clogged arteries which is integral to our understanding of heart disease.
